

GROSS INCOME FROM DIRECT CLINICAL SERVICES

Our income in the first quarter primarily included client payments for services. Our growth was significant, and even progressed despite our clinicians taking a weeklong vacation in June.



WHAT'S NEXT?

In the second quarter, we will be adding new offices into our existing office space. This will allow each clinician to have their own private office, as well as the freedom to schedule clients based on their own availability.

We will begin training our new intern, which will allow us to become more involved in our mission of training upcoming clinicians to provide more care in our community.

PROJECTED NEEDS

The renovation process to construct new offices is anticipated to cost roughly \$10,000.

With the increase in client care. we anticipate a waitlist in the upcoming months. Donations and grant writing efforts will be a focus in the second quarter. This will allow us to provide more clinical services to the community, as well as hire another licensed clinician to support the clinicians who are training and pursuing licensure.



Access 304 is especially proud of the need we have been able to fill in such a short time. We have been able to see kids, teens and adults who have been on waitlists for months elsewhere, and to also provide care for the underinsured. We have been able to see at-risk youth for same-day therapy, as well as attend to couples who are seeking to enrich their relationships. We look forward to continuing to build professional connections in our community and serve as a resource for

individuals and families as we move forward.
